New Student Checklist

Don't miss out! If you're planning to start at GCC next fall, you must complete these steps on time to receive priority registration.

Step One

- Apply to Glendale Community College for the fall semester
 - Application available online at www.glendale.edu.
 - Applying is easy and it's FREE.

Step Two

- Complete an Online Orientation
 - Once you receive your student ID number, visit www.glendale.edu/Orientation.

Step Three

- Take your Math and English/ESL Assessment Tests
 - Assessment tests are available at GCC in SF112.
 - Visit www.glendale.edu/Assessment for testing schedule and sample tests.
 - Be sure to review sample tests prior to taking assessment tests.
 - When you complete your assessment, the staff will make your appointment for a Group Academic Advising Workshop.

Step Four

- Attend your Group Academic Advising Workshop
 - A counselor will help you develop your required abbreviated Student Educational Plan (SEP).

Step Five

- Register for fall classes at GCC
 - To be eligible for priority registration, you must apply and complete your orientation, assessment tests, and abbreviated Student Educational Plan (SEP).
 - You will be notified of your registration date through MyGCC, your online student portal.
 - If you do not complete your application, orientation, assessment tests, and abbreviated SEP by the deadline, you will be allowed to register during open registration.

- You'll attend a group academic advising workshop with a GCC counselor and:
 - Learn how to use MyGCC, your student portal.
 - Create your required abbreviated Student Educational Plan (SEP).
