- **Electronic systems** for data collection and analysis in healthcare, and how these systems support patient-centered, quality healthcare
- **Public health**, including global epidemiology and disease prevention as well as local community health, and the role that nurses can play in preventative care and health promotion
- Participation in a **final capstone course** in which you will integrate and synthesize what you have learned throughout your previous courses into a final leadership project
