Dates of Trip:

A faculty committee will select SIX students to participate in an FTVM faculty led student trip to the 2024 Sundance Film Festival located in Park City, Utah. While on the trip, students will agree to follow GCC guidelines for school travel and field trips.

*****Air fare, hotel lodging, transportation to and from hotel, and festival registration fees will be covered. Attendees will be required to buy their own meals.**

No late applications will be considered.

5. Describe some of the most important attributes and qualities of a film that distinguishes a really great film from an average to mediocre film.
6. Your best friend wants to DP on your film and you don't think they're the best candidate. What would you do? How would you handle the situation?
7. Can you share an example of a time when you had to work effectively in a team with diverse personalities and opinions? How did you handle it?
8. Film festivals can be unpredictable. Give an example of a time when you had to adapt to last-minute changes or unexpected opportunities?
9. Please tell us something about your goals in the film and television industry?
10. Why do you want to go to Sundance on a GCC/FTVM led fieldtrip?

11. **Short Answer to a Scenario. Read the scenario and then answer the prompt.**

Scenario: The Late-Night Mixer

Imagine you and your fellow students are attending a late-night mixer at Sundance, with several prominent filmmakers in attendance. The atmosphere is lively, with music, drinks, and conversations flowing freely. As newcomers to the festival, you're excited but also aware that the festival atmosphere can blur the lines between social and professional interactions. You've been reminded to represent your college well, but Geri and Deb are not in attendance.

Suddenly, you find yourself witnessing a fellow student, let's call them Alex, getting overly familiar with a prominent filmmaker who seems uncomfortable with the attention. It's unclear whether Alex is aware of the filmmaker's discomfort. Meanwhile, others at the party are starting to notice the situation, too.

Your task is to respond to this scenario with the following prompt:

Sundance can feel like a social event, but it's also a professional one. How would you shape your behavior accordingly? What considerations would you take to represent your college positively?
