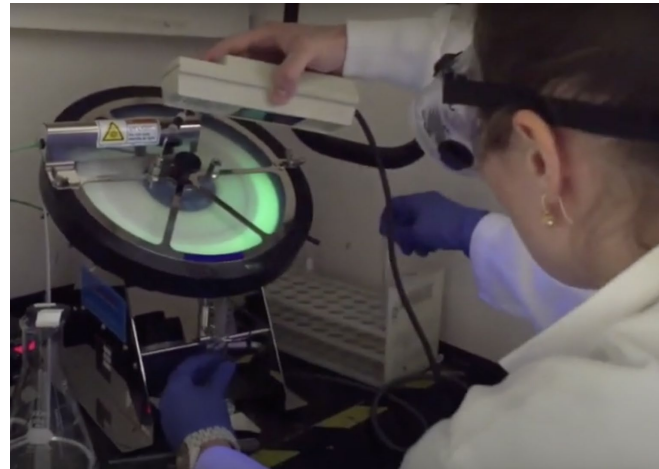

2. **Submit an application for financial aid**
Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) OR California Dream Act Application (CADAA) with GCC's federal school code
3. **Complete request form**
GCC will contact you to schedule an appointment with a promise plus counselor
4. **Attend GCC full-time** (at least 12-credits or 6-units w/ accommodations)
5. **Register & complete Summer Bridge with a passing grade:** Student Development course as orientation

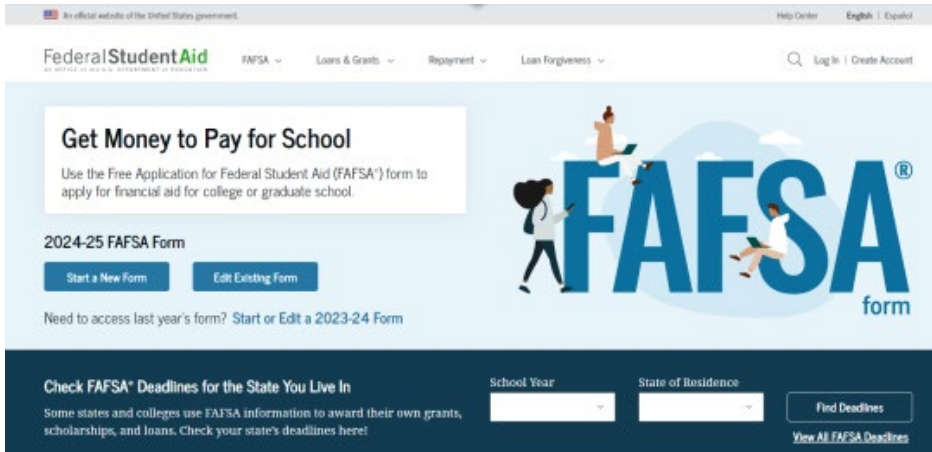

This FAFSA season will be different!

Why? Because FAFSA Simplification is here!

FAFSA Simplification represents the most overhaul of the FAFSA in **40 years**.

The FAFSA **process, form, and formula** are all being updated.

The 2024-2024 FAFSA is delayed until **December 2023!**

FAFSA Simplification- Better FAFSA?

The new FAFSA is being referred to as Better FAFSA, Better Future.

Goals include:

- An updated and more streamlined process redesigned form
- Reduce the number of questions
- Expanded eligibility and transparency, specifically for Federal Pell Grant
- A more secure and stable platform



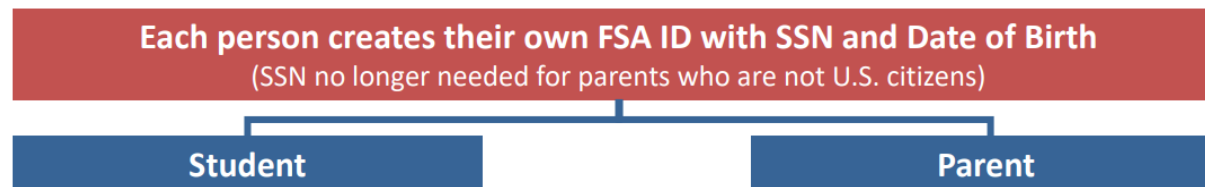


FSA ID Related

FSA ID Related Changes

An FSA ID will be required for anyone trying to access the FAFSA.

- No Option to start a FAFSA using the student's demographic information
- Married filing joint tax filers will only need one of the tax filers will have to have an FSA ID.
- When parents are married and filing separately or biological parents are not married but living together, both parents will need to have their own FSA ID.
- An FSA ID will need to be matched with SSA (Plan for match to take up to a week) before it can be used
- Every Time an FSA Id is used, two-step verification will be required
- Currently only students are subject to two-step verification when accessing their FAFSA/w an FSA ID
- Contributing parent(s) will log in and see only parent-related questions
- Individuals without a SSN will be able to create an FSA ID

New Financial Aid Terms

Student Aid Index (SAI)

The Student Aid Index (SAI) replaces the Expected family Contribution (EFC)

Contributors

A new term referring to anyone required to provide consent on the FAFSA. Possible contributors include the student, parent, other parent, and student spouse.

The Direct Data Exchange (DDX)

The Direct Data Exchange (DDX) replaces the IRs Data Retrieval Tool (DRT) and Includes increased security provisions.

Federal Tax Information (FTI)

Federal Tax information (FTI) will come directly from the IRS and be transferred into the FTI module. It will not be visible in the FAFSA or on the FAFSA summary (FSS)

Consent and Approval

Contributor (s) must provide consent and approval to use their information to match with IRS, allow IRS to disclose their federal tax information (FTI), the DOE to use their FTU and redisclose their FTI to schools and organization.

Family Size

Family size replaces household size and is pulled directly from the tax return but its updatable within their FAFSA.

FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS)

Summary of FAFSA information that replaces the Student Aid Report (SAR)

Family Size

Is the parent's family size different from the number of individuals claimed on their 2022 tax return?

Family size includes: The parent (and their spouse), The student, other people, if they now live with the parent and the parent will provide more than half of their support between July 1, 2024, and June 30, 2025. This includes dependent children who meet these criteria, even if they live apart because of college enrollment.



Role-Based Form


The FAFSA will become a Roles-Based Form

- The individual starts the FAFSA and “invites” other contributors, will have to provide the contributors’ legal name, date of birth, SSN, and email address
- Items must provided and match the information used to create that contributor’s FSA (expect for email)

Contributors to the FAFSA® Form



Parents or Spouses
Answers to the FAFSA form will determine if any contributors need to be identified. These contributors will complete their own sections of the form and are asked to provide personal and financial information, but will not become financially responsible for the student's education.



How to Invite
Contributors will need to log in with their own FSA ID to provide their information. To invite a contributor to a FAFSA form, you'll need to provide their name, date of birth, Social Security number, and email address.

This FAFSA® Form Still Needs Contributor Information

The invited contributor(s) will receive an email invitation to join this form every seven days until the application is complete.

We strongly recommend that the student completes their own section. If that isn't possible, you can manually provide their information, but they will not be eligible for federal student aid, including grants and loans, until they provide consent and approval, and sign the form.

Independent Students

Other students can continue to be considered independent students on the 2024-25 FAFSA form and will not be required to have their parents be contributors.

For the 2024-25 award year, an independent student is one of the following:

- born before Jan. 1, 2001
- married (and not separated)
- a graduate or professional student
- a veteran
- a member of the armed forces
- an orphan
- a ward of the court
- someone with legal dependents other than a spouse
- an emancipated minor
- someone who is unaccompanied and homeless or self-supporting and at risk of being homeless

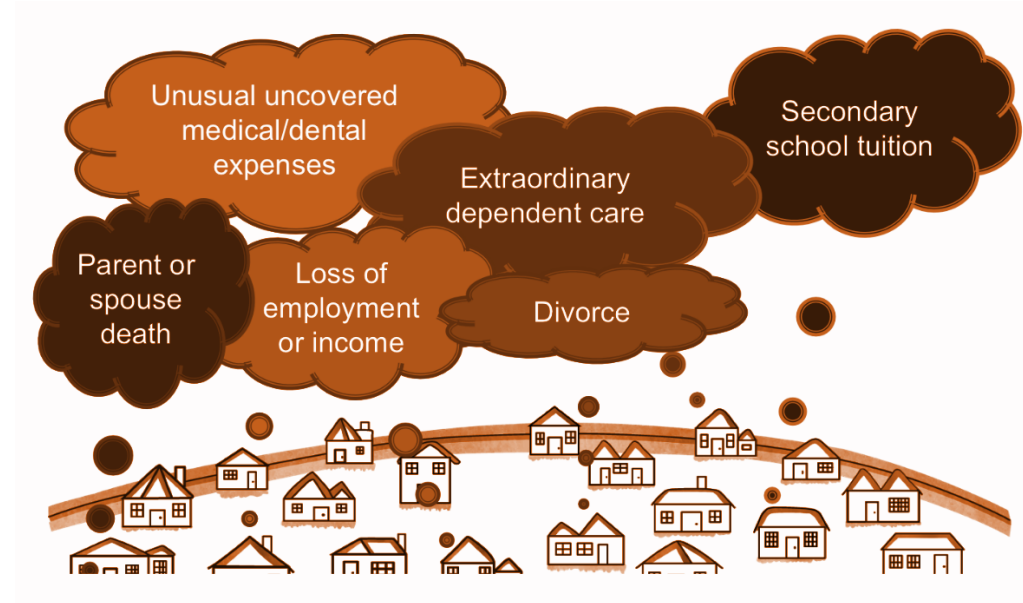
COVID Impacts?

Dependency Status - Are you a student under the age of 24 with an unusual living situation that make it impossible for you to have contact with your parents?

- A parent is in jail/prison or in a mental health facility
- You moved out of your parent's home due to abusive home conditions when you were below 18 years of age
- For the majority of your childhood you were raised by people other than your parents
- Your parent has passed away and the other parent's whereabouts are unknown

Change in Income

Students and families sometimes experience changes in income and or resources (such as job loss, illness, etc.) during the application period or academic year. In such cases, the FAFSA or CADAA may not accurately reflect your family's financial circumstances. If this applies to you, notify the [Financial Aid Office](#) as early as possible.

Overview of Cal Grant Reform

Restructure Cal Grant Program in 2024-25

- In the 2022-23 budget package, the state adopted potential new rules for the Cal Grant program—known as Cal Grant reform.
- Cal Grant reform would be triggered on in 2024-25 if the state determines in spring 2024 that sufficient General Fund is available.

Workshops for Counselors



During the 2022-23 academic year, DSPS served students approximately 800 students with these disability categories at Verdugo and Garfield (rounded):

Acquired Brain Injury	<1%
Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)	12%
Autism Spectrum	14%
Blind/Low Vision	3%
Deaf/Hard of Hearing	4%
Developmentally Delayed Learner	3%
Learning Disability	27%
Mobility/Physical	10%

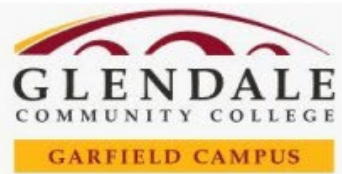
Talking Points

- To register with DSPS, a student must complete a DSPS application and submit a verification of a disability (such as an IEP, 504 plan, etc.) to the Center for Students with Disabilities (CSD).
- After they submit their documents, they make an appointment to meet with a DSPS counselor. During that appointment, they will have an intake and complete an Academic Accommodation Plan and a term-specific Student Educational Contract.
- A referral is then sent to the Accommodations Resource Center (ARC). The student will meet with Specialists to set up accommodations and services.
- Students are responsible for setting up services and accommodations in a timely manner each term. Services and accommodations do not automatically “roll over” each term.



DSPS provides

- Academic counseling.
- Accommodations based on eligibility and need, such as extended time on tests and quizzes, note taking service, ASL interpreting, real time captioning, alternative media such as audio books and Braille, assistive technology, assistance with study strategies, etc.
- Classes
 - Adapted PE (swim, spin, Tai Chi, gym, activities)
 - Student Development 105 orientation
 - Adapted computer (word processing, etc)
- DSPS is **not** a continuation of special education.
 - ~Special education does not exist in college/university.
 - ~Classes and course content are not modified (changed) for students registered with DSPS. For ex, a student with DSPS cannot complete fewer assignments, take fewer tests/quizzes, or be graded on a different scale.

To qualify for the EOPS program services, students must meet the eligibility criteria listed below

1. Be a California resident or AB 540 Dreamer as determined by GCC Admissions and Records Office
2. Be enrolled in 12 or more units when accepted into the program
 - Current or former Foster Youth must be registered in at least one course and working towards 9 units per term
 - DSPS students (6+ units with DSPS counselor verification)
1. Not have completed more than 70 units of degree applicable credit course work in any combination of post-secondary higher education (college/ university)
2. Be low income to qualify for CCPG A, B, and C (\$0 EFC)
3. Meet ONE of the following disadvantaged criteria:
 - Registered in English or Math below the level required for the associate degree at GCC, or ESL NOTE: A placement into GCC graduation or transfer level English or Math with support units designated with a (+) also meets this criterion (ex. Math 30+, Math 90+ and English 101+)
 - Not have graduated from HS or obtained the General Education Diploma (GED)
 - Graduated from HS with a GPA below 2.5
 - Been previously enrolled in remedial education courses in HS or college
 - First generation college student (neither parent has earned a Bachelor's degree)
 - Member of college identified underrepresented group (African-American/Black, American- Indian/Alaskan Native, Asian/Pacific Islander, and Hispanic/Latino)
 - The primary language spoken in the student's home is/was non-English
 - The student is current or former foster youth



International Students at GCC

- Current F-1 students or those wanting to become F-1 students (change of status)

Must apply by stated transfer student deadlines at www.glendale.edu/international/apply

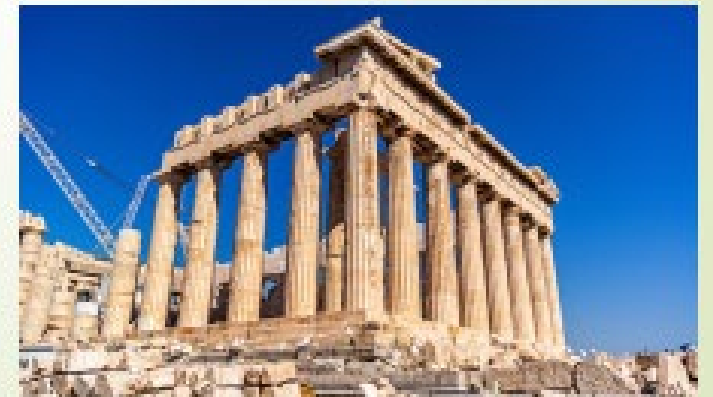
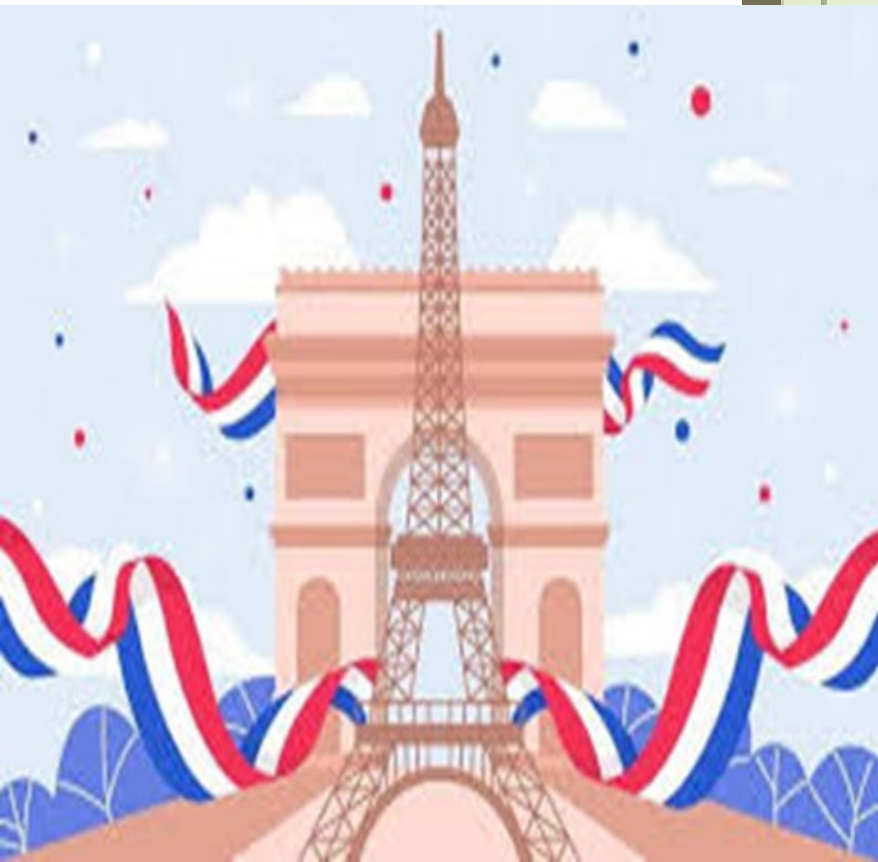
