UC Dual Admission



- New program for students who applied/will apply for freshman admission for the Fall 2023, 2024, or 2025 terms
- Get **guaranteed admission** to a participating campus and major (via the TAG program)
 - Must complete transfer requirements within 3 years
- To be eligible, students must:
 - Be a California resident (AB 540 is fine)
 - Not admitted to any UC campus to which they applied
 - Have at least a 3.0 UC GPA at the time of application
 - Be missing one or more A-G subject requirements at the time of high school graduation



UC Dual Admission



- Selected students are identified using information from the UC application
- They will receive an email with details about the program
- To opt in, they will need to log into their UC application to see full details and accept the offer
- June 1 is the deadline to opt in
- Not a binding agreement



CSU Transfer Success Pathway (TSP)



- New program for students who graduated/left high school in 2023 **or** took a gap year after 2022 graduation
- No college enrollment past HS graduation
- Get **guaranteed admission** to a CSU and major of your choice*
 - Must complete transfer requirements within 3 years
- *Not all majors at all campuses are available in this agreement
- Students apply through the CSU Transfer Planner between August 1 and September 30
- Not a binding agreement

IGETC

- Accepted by UCs and CSUs
- Updated for students beginning in **Fall 2023**
- Both courses must be from 2 different disciplines in Area 4

Cal-GETC

- Singular pathway for students transferring to UC or CSU
- For students beginning in **Fall 2025**
- Both courses must be from 2 different disciplines in Area 4

- Students who plan to transfer where an ADT exists for their intended major will be "placed" on that ADT pathway
- For example: Student wants to major in Psychology; their student education plan created with a counselor will have them meeting the requirements for the Psychology ADT



Benefits of the ADT



- Meet all lower-division major prep at most of the CSU campuses that offer a **similar major**
- 0.1 GPA bump at impacted campuses
- Take only 60 units after transfer to earn the BA or BS
- GCC currently offers 28 ADTs
- Guaranteed admission into the CSU system

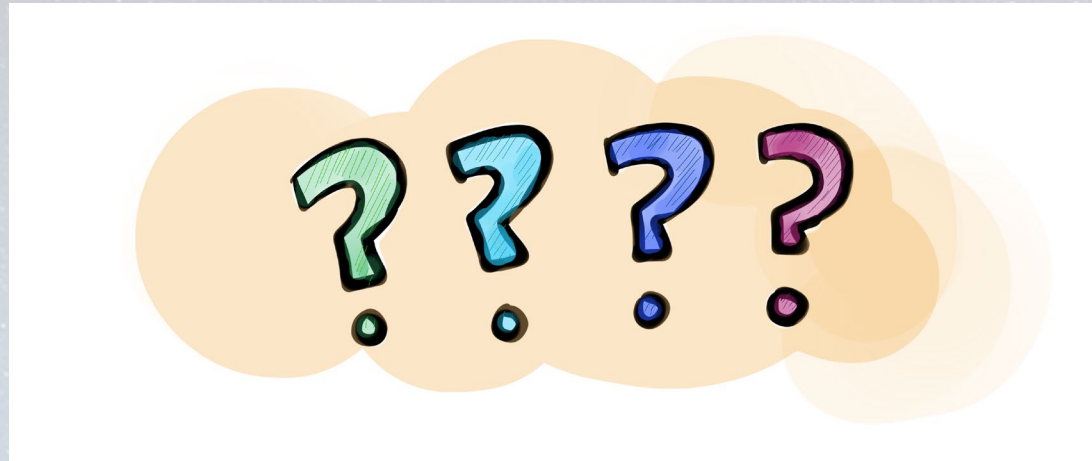

Faculty Diversity Internship Program

The Faculty Diversity Internship Program trains and prepares interns, interested in teaching at a community college, for future faculty employment opportunities. The intent of the program is to increase the pool of potential candidates that reflect the diversity of our student population in the local community, greater Los Angeles area, and internationally. The program offers professional development workshops on various instructional related topics and classroom training under the guidance of a mentor in a specific discipline. Refer to the [Minimum Qualifications List](#) (pdf) to review qualifications for each discipline. Applications will be accepted for all disciplines including, but not limited to, the following areas: **Biology, Chemistry, Nursing, Economics, English, English as a Second Language (ESL), Marketing, Math, Music, Social Sciences, Sociology, Speech/Communications, Counseling (Student Development Instruction)**

The Faculty Internship Program is a 7 month program that begins in June and concludes in December. Program activities for 2023 internship will be hybrid. In order to complete the program interns are required to participate in ALL activities, which include weekdays and Saturdays. The professional development activities include:

Summer Training Institute

The Summer Training Institute includes an orientation, workshops, preparation for teaching internship, and meetings with a mentor. There are a minimum of five (all day) training sessions which will be held during the week and Saturdays.

Fall Teaching Internship

The Fall Teaching Internship includes class observation, classroom activities (under the supervision of the mentor) which include preparing and teaching course topics and grading papers. During this time, the intern will also attend campus activities and meetings with a mentor. **There are a minimum of sixteen (16) classroom sessions required with the mentor. The days and times will vary.**

Eligibility Requirements

The eligibility requirements are:

1. No community college teaching experience. Applicants with teaching experience in the following areas are eligible:
 - Teacher's Assistant
 - K-12 teaching experience
2. Must be in good academic standing at an accredited college or university.

A. General Education Disciplines - Graduate students within one year of completing a master's or doctoral degree program

B. Career Technical Education (CTE) - Six years of related work experience and within one year of completing an Associate degree, or four years of related work experience and within one year of completing a Bachelor's degree

C. Degree Holders - Meet faculty minimum qualifications. Please refer to [GCC Minimum Qualifications](#)

Graduate Counseling Internship Program

Glendale College offers a graduate internship program for students who have completed their first year of graduate school in counseling, psychology, social work, marriage and family counseling, rehabilitation counseling, and career counseling at a WASC accredited university program.

Graduate Counseling Interns are considered volunteers of the Glendale Community College District, but activities are designed to fulfill a broad range of para-professional hours for fieldwork or internship requirements of Master's Degree programs. Graduate Student Interns have special interests in working in counseling departments, in which duties range between learning and understanding academic, career, students with disabilities, as well as teaching in Student Development courses.

Program Overview

This internship is a 1-year commitment, of fall and spring semesters at a minimum of 10 hours per week. Intern duties are, but are not limited to:

1. Supervised drop-in counseling
2. Supervised individual counseling and Student Education Plan (SEP) development
3. Co-facilitation of Promise Plus orientation workshops
4. Co-facilitate Promise Plus student success workshops
5. Co-facilitate STDV 100/101/103/125/127/145
6. Attend counseling related professional development and shared governance training sessions and meetings.
