Administrative Regulations

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE

Glendale Community College shall cooperate with local, state and federal health officers in the implementation of those measures deemed necessary for the prevention and control of communicable diseases among students. The College shall, in addition comply with any immunization program required by the State Department of Health Services.

Office of Primary Responsibility: Student Health Services

The Health Center staff shall comply with any immunization program required by State Department of Health Services regulations.

The Student Health Center provides:

1. Health education and intervention for communicable disease prevention, including disease reporting to the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health;
2. Tuberculosis (TB) testing; Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) vaccination; Tetanus (Td); Tetanus, Diphtheria, Acellular Pertussis (Tdap) vaccinations; and Influenza vaccinations; and
3. Community referrals for meningitis vaccination, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccination, varicella vaccination, pneumonia vaccination, COVID-19 vaccinations, and travel vaccines.
